
A book review is a form of literary criticism in which a book is analysed based on content, style, and merit.






"The Diary of a Young Girl" Ann Frank 1929- 1945.

"Mein Kampf" by Adolf Hitler 1889-1945



"My Struggle" is an autobiography by Nazi leader Adolf Hitler, in which he outlines his political thinking and future plans for Germany. Hitler began writing it while in imprisoned for political crimes in 1923. Hitler hoped that sales of his book would help pay for his legal fees. By the time he became leader of Germany in 1933 Hitler had sold 240,000 copies. When his Nazi party was in power during World War 2, many Germans kept a copy on display on their coffee tables. By the time of Hitler's suicide in 1945 ten million copies of his book had been made.

"Make the lie big, make it simple, keep saying it, and eventually they will believe it."

Sometimes the author's purpose can be seen by reading their biographies.






A writer chooses a subject is due to a combination, of knowledge, experience and motivation.

John Steinbeck, Jr. (1902 – 1968) was an American writer. He wrote 27 books, including "Of Mice and Men" Steinbeck received the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1962, this is the greatest prize that a writer can receive. He lived in a small country town in a farming area. He spent his summers working on nearby ranches and later with migrant workers. There he became aware of the harsher aspects of life and the darker side of human nature, which supplied him with material expressed in "Of Mice and Men".



How might Steinbeck's life helped him choose to write "Of Mice and Men"?





Of Mice and Men was published in 1937, it tells the tragic story of George and Lennie, two homeless migrant ranch workers, who move from place to place in search of new job opportunities during the Great Depression in California, USA.

The intended audience is who the author writes for. When writing about an intended audience, focus on broad categories and then become more precise.



Because "King of Shadows" is a mixture of genres, classic and fantasy, it is difficult to decide who exactly is the intended audience. If you love Shakespeare and time travel you will love the book, but on the other hand some people who consider themselves to be purists of Shakespeare might find this book a bit tacky.



"King of Shadows" would suit young adult readers. High school students who have been asked to find out more about Shakespeare might this an enjoyable way to learn about Shakespeare's world.



Readers with an interest in theatre, time travel, 17th century England and Elizabethan times will enjoy reading Suzan Cooper's "King of Shadows".






